Sadly, the damage to her leg was extensive, and it was necessary to amputate. She is now happy and healthy, jumping and playing with 3 legs. As you can imagine, the surgery was expensive. And this is just one of the many animals Cat Matchers has helped in 2009.



This year, Cat Matchers' volunteers helped rescue cats and kittens from a "hoarder's" house, volunteered to help the survivors of a "puppy mill" raid and assisted several people by providing medical care for their beloved cats that might otherwise have gone untreated or been euthanized. We even pitched in to help 19 dogs that were in need of a home and extensive medical care. There are so many stories we would love to share with you, but there's not enough room here! As we look back over this last year, we're so thankful for the things we have been able to accomplish, because of our generous supporters. In spite of the economy, extra effort by our dedicated volunteers resulted in 267 adoptions this year (10/1/08-9/30/09). That's 51 more than last year. We also spayed/neutered 258 cats and rescued 358 cats from local animal shelters and the cold, cruel streets. And this year we've helped more pet owners financially than ever before.

Nothing good comes easy; everyone knows that. We've tried to help where we can, but our costs are great. That's why we need your help. It's heartbreaking when we run out of resources to help the animals, but we still have to look them in the eyes.

We know that times are tough as our economy struggles and you may have demands on your already stretched dollar. patella. Her knee won't stay in the joint. We are trying to raise funds to help her: the vet bill will be over \$1000 to fix her problem.
